Anchor Place Permanent Supportive Housing in Long Beach

Anchor Place is transit-oriented housing in Long Beach, featuring 120 units of affordable, permanent supportive housing. Seventy-five units are reserved for veterans and 18 are reserved for families who are currently homeless and/or have a mental illness.

Residents shared how Anchor Place provides both the housing stability as well as the **on-site services and staff** they need. Residents also have access to other neighboring resources, including a healthcare clinic, social service organizations, and community programs. Ayana, a veteran and mother, shared the value of the service-rich community: “**This should be the model so that when someone says affordable housing [this is what they picture] . . . You have the apartment, you have rehab, you have US VETS, you have the computer lab, you have psychiatry, you have town hall meetings.**”

In addition to partially financing the building, AHSC provided financing for a new bus stop and transit hub, including new street lighting and pedestrian safety improvements. Residents highlighted the importance of this **new bus stop "right outside your front door,"** which connects residents with the places they need to go, like the VA hospital or visiting family.
